What is BusConnects?

BusConnects is the National Transport Authority's (NTA) programme to greatly improve bus services in Irish cities. BusConnects is included in the Government's National Development Plan 2021 – 2030 and the Climate Action Plan 2024.

What's happening in Waterford?

BusConnects Waterford is a programme of eight measures to fundamentally transform Waterford's bus system. This programme will assist in realising the ambition of the Waterford Transport Strategy to significantly increase public transport use.

One of the strategies of BusConnects Waterford is to improve the design of the bus routes themselves. The New Bus Network for Waterford will greatly enhance bus travel with new and improved services transforming the public transport network.

The benefits of the New Bus Network

- More than double of an increase in services.
- Shorter waits and easier interchange, thanks to better frequencies.
- Straighter and faster journeys.
- Better frequencies on Sundays and in the early mornings.
- New service in areas such as Kilbarry, Skibereen, Dunmore Road and Slieverue.


How Did We Get Here?


In 2024 the NTA held a public consultation on a draft new bus network for Waterford. Waterford residents, workers, business owners and students weighed-in on the proposed changes. There were over 300 comments and feedback submissions on the draft new network. The NTA made changes in response to this public feedback, before finalising the Waterford New Bus Network.

What Happens Next?

The NTA plans to commence the implementation of the New Waterford Bus Network from 2026. As part of BusConnects, the NTA are also advancing work on the Sustainable Transport Corridors which will improve travel times on the bus network and improve connections for pedestrians and cyclists. Other parts of the BusConnects programme, like simpler fares, will be delivered with the new bus network. When is the bus network changing?


The new bus network will be introduced in 2026 so there will be plenty of time to get familiar with your new routes and bus numbers.
