

This is called Next Generation Ticketing or NGT.




Up to now, LEAP cards have worked well for our customers.

Customers are at the centre of our new system.




You will be able to pay your fare using a bank card, mobile phone, or other smart device.

NGT will work out the cheapest fare for your journey.




It will still give discounts for young adults and students.



There will be a new app so you can store your tickets digitally.

Putting the new system in place





We need to:

 Change all the LEAP card devices to NGT devices



Change the devices on buses and at stops



 Change the devices at Luas platforms and train gates



 Have a new online system where customers can buy tickets safely.



While we make the changes, customers still need to be able to use their LEAP cards.



The 2 systems will have to work alongside each other for a while.



We need to design and test new financial and customer support systems.



We will follow the laws for bank cards.

This will keep information safe.

When will I be able to pay my fare with my phone?





We will see how the equipment works for customers.



We will make sure the equipment is accessible.



The new machines will take LEAP cards and Public Service Cards for free travel.



Customers will not have to change how they use public transport.



By 2028, you will be able to pay by debit or credit card, phone, and bank card.



This will start on Luas and Dublin city bus services.



By the end of 2028, it will be on all DART and rail services in the Greater Dublin Area.
